

Pathways of the Pioneers

Pathways of the Pioneers is a series of 117 historical stories about the development and growth of the Seventh-day Adventist church, prepared by the Lake Union Office of Education. They tell of the exciting, troublesome, difficult, and wonderful years from the time of William Miller until the death of Ellen G. White. Each story is in the form of a skit complete with suggested sound effects because it was prepared from an audio series. The sound effects have been included in case they are needed, but it is perfectly acceptable to present these skits with few or no sound effects.

This resource as hardcopy is available because of the dedication and hard work of volunteers Darlene and Bob Griffin. Their enthusiasm never flagged throughout the long process of typing hundreds of pages of manuscripts into the computer, then listening to the audio cassettes to add the changes that were made when the stories were dramatized. Their personal interest led them to additionally prepare a timeline of all 117 stories which is separately available. It is doubtful whether any of this work would ever have been completed without their help.
