



RECYCLE WRAP

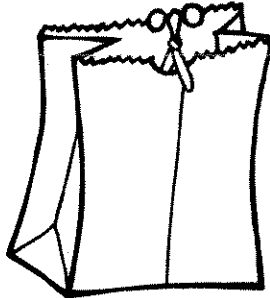
"God does not see the same way people see. People look at the outside of a person, but the Lord looks at the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7b).



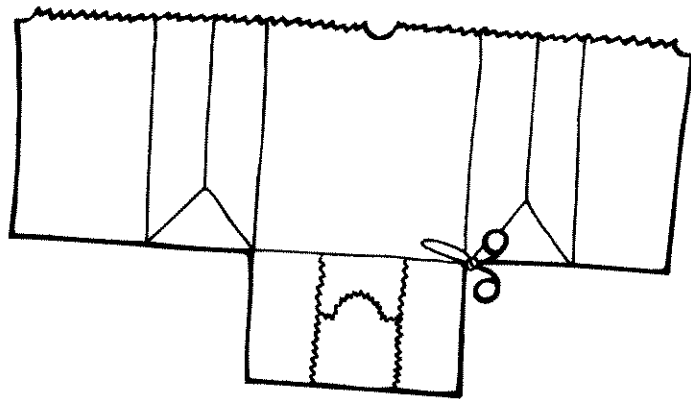
A great use for the good old grocery bag! This nifty idea saves money, saves trees, and makes beautiful packages.

SUPPLIES

- paper grocery bags
- scissors
- rubber stamps
- ink pads
- gold metallic markers



1. Demonstrate how to cut down the seam of a grocery bag, then cut away the bottom.

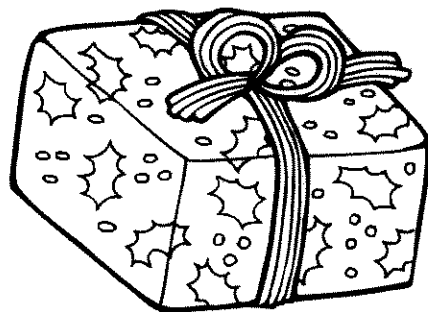
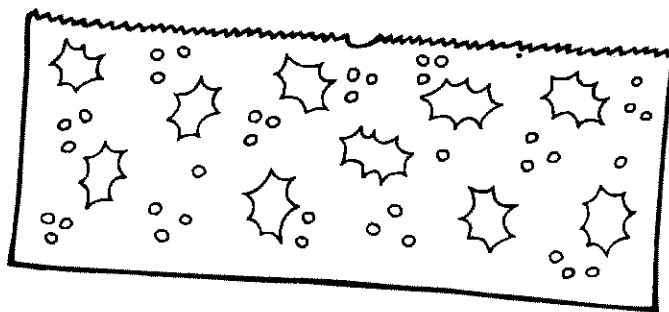


PRO POINTER

PRO POINTER

You can usually gather lots of rubber stamps by asking friends to bring what they have. Or, if you're stumped on stamps, let kids do potato prints with tempera paint.



2. Flatten the paper, plain side up. Decorate it with rubber stamps and squiggles of gold metallic ink. Voilà—you have wonderful wrapping paper.
